




Net Assets

EDUCATION

Acknowledging that postsecondary education is a necessary prerequisite for a successful future is a critical cultural shift for our communities. The hard work and ingenuity of our residents has brought us to this point, but the jobs of today and tomorrow are different than in past generations. Having professional/technical certificates and academic degrees has become a requirement. We encourage and support post-secondary education through the Monroe County College Access Network (MCCAN).

Bringing everyone along is important for broad-based economic growth but also for the health and well-being of all our friends and neighbors. Too many low-income students and students of color are not participating in the opportunities presented by this knowledge-based economy. Consequently, these populations are also subject to lack of access to healthy foods and healthcare, perpetuating the socio-economic issues that have held so many back.

The opportunity in our county is significant thanks to the concentration of industries across the greater region. Author/entrepreneur Jim Rohn also said, "You must either modify your dreams or magnify your skills." Achieving a dream requires a plan and without action no dream can come to fruition. MCCAN has set a plan and is committed to closing these gaps. We at the Community Foundation of Monroe County are very excited to be part of this. By 2025, the goal is to double the number of Monroe County residents with a degree or valuable credential from 30% to 60%. We have made a commitment to this initiative for years to come, and we need you to be part of putting this plan to work!

OTHER COMMUNITIES FOCUSED ON EDUCATION

Looking at neighboring communities, we can see opportunity take shape. Directly North, western Wayne County is one example, with education and income levels all higher than the Michigan average.

- CANTON: 53% hold an Associates or higher; median household income \$80,283
- PLYMOUTH: 58% hold an Associates or higher; township median household income \$91,087
- NORTHVILLE: 63% hold an Associates or higher; township median household income \$101.761

HEALTH & WELL-BEING

The findings of the 2015 Health Assessment are astounding and particularly troubling is that one third of Monroe County adults were obese. Conditions such as obesity have been on the rise across the country and our community and the cost of health care has been rapidly increasing as well. Changing this is well within our control, but it requires that we all participate. After all, nobody can make us eat healthy foods or take 10,000 steps daily. We need to make well-educated choices regarding our health and well-being. Consequently we have forged partnerships to help create a brighter future.

The organizations that are part of this coalition are in the 2nd year of receiving sub-grants under the Michigan Health Endowment Fund. They have taken great care to put together programming that helps people to make better choices in their daily habits, thus reducing the rate of adults being overweight/ obese. The program run by Monroe County Opportunity Program (MCOP) will improve access to healthy food. Monroe Family YMCA will focus on encouraging attendance in wellness and fitness programs. The Monroe County Health Department will provide education on healthy eating practices. These agencies, in collaboration with Monroe County Senior Centers and Goodwill Industries, are targeting seniors, low-income individuals, and people with disabilities.

WE'RE FOCUSED ON HELPING OTHERS

Another example of this grant funding at work is the ProMedica Monroe Regional Hospital Community Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) and Sexual Assault Nurse Exams (SANE) Program. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, every two minutes someone is sexually assaulted in the United States, and every 8 minutes, the victim is a child. Victims of sexual assault are robbed of their dignity and experience a lifetime of long-term mental and physical ailments. This grant includes:

- · Train and certify eight SANE and establish a SART.
- · Comprehensive treatment for victims of sexual assault and domestic violence.
- · Collaboration with community partners to provide appropriate long-term care and support during the healing process.

COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT

Monroe County is a great place to call home, but if you're reading this you probably already knew that. The genuine, family-centered environment of the area is one of the reasons that so many people choose to live here, even if working in Ohio or other parts of Michigan. While living here certainly has its benefits, we are committed to improving on what we have and make it even better.

For the communities across Monroe County to truly thrive, it is crucial that we invest time and money into the social aspects that touch our lives from the moment we walk out our front doors until we come home at night. Enriching this community can take shape in any number of ways. From funding for monuments like the World Wars Monument Fund, parks, recreation and preservation, law-enforcement support, and festivals like Christmas in Ida

and the River Raisin Jazz Festival, over the years, we at the Community Foundation have put our energy toward more projects than we can detail here.

Families of all ages benefit greatly from our parks and that has been an area of significant advancement. The Access to Recreation Fund has helped fund several parks in recent years such as: the Nature Park for the City of Milan, Unity Park for Ash Township in 2014, and Martin Luther King Jr. Park for Monroe in 2016. In 2016, we continued in this vain with a project that will benefit families with children of all ages. The Playscape at Munson Park has provided countless hours of fun to many, and through our Monroe Rotary Playscape Maintenance Fund, we will ensure that this can be sustained for year to come by providing the funding for all maintenance needs.

DOG PARK **OPPORTUNITY**

The Community Foundation of Monroe County holds the fund that will help fund a dog park for residents of the county. Throughout this year, we made a great deal of progress toward securing a site for the dog park and the infrastructure and logistics it will take to make this a reality.
