

Dear Friend:

For 40 years the Community Foundation of Monroe County has had the privilege of supporting the Monroe County community through thoughtful philanthropy. As we reflect on this fortieth year of service, we celebrate another milestone of awarding more than \$1,000,000 in grants and scholarships to our community this year. This was accomplished thanks to many generous donors who have established over 100 funds with us. We are proud to assist individuals', families and businesses fulfill their charitable goals by establishing endowed funds with us for these purposes. We take stewardship of these funds very seriously by making sure remain on in perpetuity.



During 2018 the Community Foundation took a very active role in addressing many community issues. One of our largest responses was an investment of \$100,000 in a partnership with Catholic Charities and ProMedica Monroe Regional Hospital to establish the St. Joseph Center of Hope on the ProMedica campus. The Center is a crisis intervention facility that provides a supervised, supportive setting for individuals with substance use and co-occurring disorders as an alternative to emergency care and/or jail setting.

Another cutting-edge investment was made in Monroe Public Schools. With a \$100,000 grant Monroe Public School is better equipped to combat illness by acquiring five new kiosks that feature new telehealth technology. With this new system, an elementary student who is not feeling well can see a trained staff member and access a district school nurse or health liaison via a telehealth kiosk.

Through these investments and other grants and activities, we are poised to encourage positive lasting change in our community. We also continue to build awareness about pressing issues- among these are the improvements on the River Raisin Heritage Trail -- and we are directing our attention to help our older population cope with the challenges of aging.

Please enjoy the contents of this report featuring more detailed information about our projects and community involvement. On behalf of the staff and Board of the Community Foundation, I want to thank you for your past and current support. We invite you to contact us to learn how we can work together to accomplish your charitable goals. We are here to help you in your philanthropic efforts and creating a better future for everyone.





## WE INVEST IN EDUCATION

GOAL—By 2025, the goal is to increase the post secondary achievement of Monroe County residents to 60%, by promoting a postsecondary education culture and supporting education programs aimed at improving the academic performance for all students.


In the most impoverished area of Monroe County educational attainment levels of high school completion is less than 60%. Currently the percentage of Monroe County adults (ages 25-64) with at least an associate degree is 29.2% (US Census Bureau).



## Featured Story - Tele-Health

When we learned of the correlation between absenteeism and poor academic performance, we knew we had to do something about it. This brought on our invest of \$100,000 in tele-health technology in Monroe Public Schools. Absenteeism was at a record high, where more that 22% of Arborwood Elementary School students were reported chronic absentees. District leaders said the rate increased due to the lack of accessible medical care, especially during the cold and flu season. In order to combat this, five new kiosks that feature state of the art tele-health technology. With the new system, an elementary student who is not feeling well can see a trained staff member and access a district school nurse or health liaison vie a telehealth kiosk.

"Tele-health benefits parents because it enables us to give a more comprehensive idea of what could be affecting their child, allowing them to seek the outside help they need."

## WE INVEST IN COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT

## GOAL—The Foundation will provide opportunities to enhance: community infrastructure, arts.

Michigan Council of Arts and Cultural Affairs has identified Monroe County as one of the 45 underserved communities for art opportunities.

### **Featured Story - Bookmobile**

As we all know literacy and access to these materials are fundamental to a productive society. The Community Foundation was happy to partner with the Monroe County Library System to bring back the bookmobile to provide free access to educational, informational and recreational resources to all. Our \$25,000 donation to this project will support these efforts by removing barriers, equalizing opportunities and increasing access for our community while promoting literacy and a life-long love of reading. The bookmobile has the capacity to bring 1,800 books to the most vulnerable populations in our community. Onboard technology will allow patrons to utilize the Library's extensive digital resources. Transportation issues will no longer limit a family's access to library resources.



We were so excited to get a visit from the bookmobile! The funds we provided helped bring this program back to the Monroe County Library System after a 20 year absence from our community!



## WE INVEST IN HEALTH & WELL-BEING

GOAL—The Foundation will support and provide programs that promote public health, healthy living, and physical and mental well-being for all residents of all ages of Monroe County.

The recent Community Health Assessment study found that nearly one third of Monroe County adults were obese; and that 82% of the youth population in the County were overweight obese.

### **Featured Story - St. Joseph Center of Hope**

Our call to action was very apparent when we learned that Michigan ranks 16th in the nation for drug poisoning deaths and Monroe County ranks within the top 11 in the counties for opioid mortality rates and within the top eight counties for heroin mortality rates (MDHHS). Consequently, we collaborated with Catholic Charities and ProMedica Monroe Regional Hospital to establish the St. Joseph Center of Hope on the ProMedica campus. Our investment of \$120,000 made this crisis intervention facility possible. They provide a supervised and supportive setting for individuals with substance use and co-occurring disorders as an alternative to emergency care and or jail setting. The Center is aimed at clients who require observation for safety in an appropriate setting because of an overdose and or dangerous behaviors associated with substance use. It is a safe and clean, welcoming environment where clients can stabilize, while being provided with assistance to enter a treatment program.
